

2020 Rozaire Research Award (\$2,500)

Fowler Museum at UCLA

Established in 2017 to honor the legacy of Dr. Charles E. Rozaire, the Rozaire Research Award focuses on his life's work conducting archaeological fieldwork and researching museum collections across California, the US Southwest, and Mexico. The award supports costs associated with undergraduate or graduate student research analyzing existing material cultural collections and/or archives with priority given to students using Fowler Museum collections and / or following indigenous research protocols (see Section 3 of <https://www.uvic.ca/hsd/research/igovprotocol.pdf> for an example of the latter).

ALLOWABLE EXPENSES

Award funding may be used for expenses directly related to the applicant's research project. These include travel and field location costs (flights/visas/ground transportation/local lodging/meals), and other research expenses (e.g. Internet/mobile phone, research materials, and local fees, etc.). These awards do not cover the purchase of equipment.

HOW TO APPLY:

Please indicate on the application form the award(s) for which you are eligible. Selection is based on the merits of the applicant. Application forms are available December 2, 2020 on the Fowler Museum website at <https://www.fowler.ucla.edu/opportunities/>, the Fowler Museum front lobby reception desk, or by email request from, slivsey@arts.ucla.edu. Any graduate student registered at UCLA (or receiving a graduate degree from UCLA) and planning a career in a field related to the goals of the Rozaire Award is eligible. In addition, undergraduates working on their honors thesis or a publication will be eligible to apply. ***Preference will be given to Ph.D. candidates whose proposed research project is directly related to their dissertation. Those applicants who do not have other major sources of support will receive priority consideration.***

Students from a wide range of departments are encouraged to apply. Completed applications must be received by Friday, March 13, 2020. They should be addressed to Sophie Livsey, and either mailed (address below) or dropped off at the Museum's security desk at the loading dock/east entrance (Monday-Friday 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Saturday and Sunday, 12 noon to 5 p.m.). Recipients are expected to present their findings at a roundtable session with the staff of the Fowler Museum and to credit the awards in any resultant publication, a copy of which should be provided to the museum. **Deadline: March 13, 2020.**
